BASIC PRINCIPLE OF SPORT IS FAIR PLAY !

- we usually speak about moral attitude, values
- fairness and success are often on opposite sides/ends of pole
- our task to guard/create fair conditions for each participants

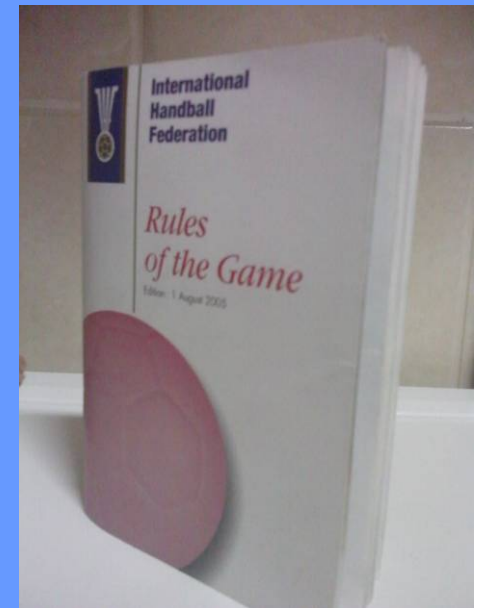
Football WC -the "crown" of provocations in final Zidane/Materazzi affair





FAIR PLAY DOES MEAN

- to respect your opponent
- To accept and respect the rules
- avoid violence on-,off playing court
- to prevent unsportsmanlike behaviour





OPINIONS BY FAMOUSE SPORTMENS

- An important part of my job like a manager: to put pressure on the referees for a **success** of my team. **I do what I let to do !**
- Jackson Richardson: A **real sportsmen** is correct on and off the playing court !
- Zinedine Zidane: There is **no** reaction without provocation, guilty is always the one who provoked !





WHAT IS THE GOAL WITH THE PROVOCATIVE BEHAVIOUR?

- to have advantage/success
- to lose the control of the opponent on his own behaviour
- **Mislead** the referees

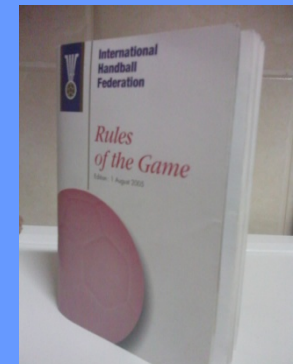

WHAT DOES THE RULES TELL US REGARDING THIS THEME ?

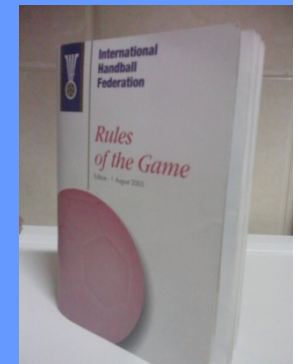
- Rule **8:4**: physical and verbal expression that are incompatible with the spirit of good sportsmanship are regarded as constituting unsportsmanlike behaviour
- Rule **16:1c**: warning **shall** be given for unsportsmanlike conduct by a player or team official
- Rule **16:3c**: suspension **shall** be given for **repeated** unsportsmanlike conduct by a player, on the court or outside the court
- Rule **16:3 Comments** :the referees have the right to determine





WHAT DOES THE RULES TELL US REGARDING THIS THEME ?

- **Clarification 5:2a:** harassing an opponent or teammate through words or gestures of a provoking nature
- **Clarification 5:2 c:** through **fake action (theatre)** trying to mislead referees regarding the actions of an opponent (e.g. pretending that foul was committed)





DIFFERENT KIND OF PROVOCATIVE BEHAVIOURS





COLLISION OR PROVOCATED OFFENSIVE FOULS

- **very little** body contact and theatrical falling down
- **no** body contact
- referee action- control , position
- always progressive?





CRYING AND FLYING PLAYERS

- **small impact on the body of attacker-clear overreaction**
- **the player gets the ball in good position, tries to take the ball and he lose**
- **contact/information to the player**





INJURY OR NOT ?

- **what means injury?**
- **after short treatment the player ready to play in defence**
- **what shall the referees do?
interrupting ?**
- **counterattacks !!!**





HIT TO FACE, NECK

- **big temptation to act like there was a big hit against the face**



action and reaction



IMMOBILIZING AN OPPONENT ' S ARM

- to open space for teammate
- mislead the referees -which player committed a foul
- Fouls from both players at the same time





VERBAL PROVOCATION

- **complaining, harassing on opponent**
- **gestures**
- **"key players" actions**





SUBSTITUTIONS AREA

- **influence on the referees -verbal, facial and gesture against the referees/officals**
- **Repeated unsportsmanlike behaviours against the referees by team officials**
- **cooperation table / referees**





COMMON LINE IN RULES INTERPRETATION

- react in first case, **setup** a clear line !
- **reduce and eliminate** the unfair actions - be consequent !
- always progressive ?





COMMON LINE IN RULES INTERPRETATION

- trying to mislead the referees (small- limited contact) - first case : **information**
- in repeated case: **warning**
- **Mislead** the referees , harassing an opponent
- **suspension !**
