

BEACH HANDBALL - GLOSSARY OF TERMS

TERM	EXPLANATION	INCORRECT
advantage (rule of)	a clause in the Rules of the Game that gives the referees the discretion to allow play to continue even after a foul has been committed if stopping play would unfairly punish the fouled team	
assist	a goal by a teammate	
call	the decision made by a referee	<i>whistle</i>
clarifications on the rules	a clarification is used to make a statement in a rule of the game more clear	<i>clarifications of the rules, clarifications to the rules</i>
coin toss	the practice of throwing a coin in the air to choose between two alternatives	
creative	having the ability or power to create; characterized by originality and expressiveness; imaginative	
Fair Play (or Fairplay)	conformity to established rules; upright conduct and equitable conditions; conformance to the rules, spirit, and etiquette of sport. More grandly, it may be considered the ethos of sport	
fast break	scoring position as quickly as possible, so that the defense is outnumbered and does not have time to set court; a specially marked horizontal area within which the game is played	<i>counterattack, fastbreak</i>
field of play (FOP)	a specific hand signal by the referees warning in advance or beforehand (for passive play)	
forwarning (signal)	a free-throw restarts the play after an interruption by the referees; when an infraction of the Rules is committed the team fouled gets possession of the ball from the spot where the infraction took place without being defended closer than 1m.	<i>freethrow</i>
free-throw, free throw	occurs when a player, who has possession of the ball, drops or mishandles the ball that is in play	
fumbling	the golden goal is a method used to decide the winner of period in a draw after the end of regulation time.	<i>sudden death</i>
golden goal	the intermission between the periods of the play which lasts 5'	<i>intermission</i>
half time	flying through the air	<i>in flight</i>
inflight	violation of a rule of the game	
infraction, infringement	a foul committed by an offensive player; illegal contact committed by an offensive player	<i>attacker's fault</i>
offensive foul	to serve as a referee	<i>refereeing</i>
officiating	the passing of the ball to turn over possession of the ball to a teammate	
pass	occurs when the attacking team does not make sufficient progress (eventually releasing a shot on goal)	
passive play	a type of free throw taken from out of the goal area line (approximately 6m.) and with only the goalkeeper of the defending team between the penalty taker and	<i>penalty</i>
penalty throw, 6m-throw	the time (10') during which play proceeds. A Beach Handball match is consisted of 2 X 10' periods	
period	the action of stepping with one foot while keeping the other foot at its point of contact with the ground

progressive punishment	the system of discipline where the penalties increase upon repeated occurrences	
protest	a formal objection (or complaint) addressed to the Competition Management when the team feel that the rules are not being correctly applied	
rebound	controlling the ball following a missed shot	
referee-throw	taken from the center of court, the referee throws the ball vertically between two players of the two teams	<i>referee throw</i>
screen	when a player obstructs the vision or motion of another player without causing undue contact	
shootout	a means of resolving a tie, in which an equal number of players from each side alternately take individual shots on the goal defended by the goalkeeper	<i>shoot-out</i>
shot	a player's attempt to score a goal	
sideline	the lines which mark the outer boundaries of a court. The opposite of a sideline is a goal line	<i>side line</i>
spectacular (goal)	of the nature of a spectacle; impressive or sensational; sensational in appearance or thrilling in effect; having a quality that thrusts itself into attention; a lavishly	
spin shot	a shot taken with full turn of the body on the point of the toe or the ball of the foot	<i>pirouette</i>
steal, interception	taking the ball away from an opponent or intercepting a pass	
table officials	scorekeeper and timekeeper	
team time-out	a requested break in action by a team with the possession of the ball	<i>team timeout, team time out</i>
technical officials (TOs)	the referees, delegates and table officials	
throw-in	the play used to restart play after the ball has gone over the sideline	<i>throw in</i>
time-out	stoppage in the match for a short amount of time	<i>timeout, time out</i>
traveling	a violation of the rules that occurs when a player takes too many steps without dribbling the ball	<i>steps</i>
turnover	a turnover occurs when a team gives possession to the opposing team by losing the ball by any means (pass being intercepted, missed shot, infraction of the rules)	<i>turn over</i>
unsportsmanlike conduct	a player, official or team who have acted inappropriately in the context of the game, not necessary illegal according to the Rules of the Game but frowned upon the vast majority of both players and spectators
