EHF Competitions Commission / Technical Refereeing Committee

The Competition Commission (CC) has been part of the EHF structure since the foundation of the European Handball Federation in 1991/1992. Back then, there was a Technical Commission dealing with all the technical matters in handball.

Due to the rapid development in handball, the Technical Commission soon split into two new commissions, the Competitions Commission and the Methods Commission. The responsibility of the CC is to deal with all competition matters of EHF events, playing systems of competitions, and the Referee and Delegate systems. In order to guarantee high level officiating all over the European handball courts, various programmes have been targeting referee- and delegate education with a special focus on young referees and female referees.

To take the subject to the next level, the EHF Executive Committee took a decision to set up a new specialised body. The EHF Technical Refereeing Committee (TRC) has been called into being to serve as a kind of "think tank" contributing to the further development of the European refereeing standards.

At the 2012 EHF Congress in Monaco Leopold Kalin/SLO was elected EHF CC Chairman and Dragan Nachevski/MKD EHF CC Member Refereeing. Educational programmes in refereeing are in the responsibility of the EHF Competence Academy&Network (CAN), closely cooperating with EHF CC and TRC.

EHF Competence Academy & Network (EHF CAN) - Organiser

The European Handball Federation (EHF) is the governing body of Handball in Europe! Its 50 Member Federations represent and stand for 50 different kinds of national and international handball know-how. Those individual national handball schools/philosophies shall be made use of by involving experts in order to contribute to the variety of handball education in Europe! Handball know-how exchange and transfer in Europe shall be fostered as an EHF service for the EHF Member Federations by making use of national and international handball experts as well as external lecturers from sport science, medicine, other sports, economy (marketing, equipment suppliers) and media (press, TV, Internet).

The EHF Competence Academy & Network (EHF CAN) shall be established as an educational service centre for EHF Member Federations with the possibility of granting scholarships in order to minimize or delete financial burdens for them. The same holds good for internal EHF Office management training on the job.

The EHF "CAN" shall be established to develop and deliver sport specific educational and training programmes in order to ensure that coaches, officials, athletes and

administrators from all over Europe (and the world) have access to the highest quality education relating to "handball know-how" and competence in e-learning, blended learning, interdisciplinary educational courses of various duration, summer schools or mainstream 2-4 semester courses within the European Education Credit Transfer System (ECTS framework).

The EHF "CAN" shall set-up Business Executive Education programmes for further educating and training sporting administrators, resort managers and event executives in the Handball Event Management Business, e.g. also in event-related courses.

The EHF "CAN" shall contain a documentation centre including production of modern teaching aids and media as well as cooperation agreements with research & developing partners, suppliers, universities and testifying institutions.

The EHF "CAN" is responsible for both, EHF Lecturer and programme coordination in this seminar.

The 2016 EHF Referee Seminar will be held with 14 couples out of which the 12 couples for the EHF Women's EURO in Sweden will be selected.



Course Basics

Currently the EHF is in full swing of preparing the various events for the 2016/17 season, especially the 2016 EHF Women's EURO that will be organized in Sweden in December 2016. After concluding the qualification matches the draw for the final tournament took place in Gothenburg/SWE on 10 June 2016.

A combined EHF Referee/ Delegate event will take place on the weekend from 2nd - 4th September 2016 in Vienna and will start on Friday afternoon at 14.00 hrs. with the official opening. The closing for Delegates is planned for Saturday at around 11.45 hrs., for Referees on Sunday at around 11.45 hrs.

Objectives

The EHF strives towards attaining a new level of preparation. The programme for EHF top referees contains specific preparatory activities for an EHF top event.

- Physical fitness assessment testing (shuttle run with lactate) and follow-up programmes
- Mental skills and methods (with emphasis on "emotions and performance", body language and "stress performance")
- On- court officiating (video examples) with particular reference to the new IHF Rules of the Game valid as of 1st July 2016
- Pro-active discussions regarding primary points of cooperation with the EHF delegates
- Stressing the importance of coherence in behaviour and actions

The EHF Delegate task training will focus on:

- EHF Delegate Task Agenda (from arrival to departure) - event management, game administration
- EHF Delegate performance features "before- during- after" the game
- Behaviour and Performance Training Tools
- Observer system and online platform instruction
