DELEGATES' TASKS

Balatonboglar, August, 2005

· INSPECTION OF THE PLAYING COURT

- ✓ Line system
- ✓ Goals—well anchorage?
- ✓ No material inside the court
- Reserve balls and their appropriate baskets

· INSPECTION OF THE PLAYERS

- ✓ Numbers
- ✓ Sport Clothes
- √ Goalkeeper's shirt
- ✓ Check the players don't wear dangerous protections (e.g. Mask, bracelet, ...)

· INSPECTION OF THE TABLE

(Timekeepers and Secretary)

- ✓ Reserve clocks
- ✓ Automatic clock, does it work properly?
- ✓ Cards:
 - * Team Time Out (T.T.O)
 - * Suspension (1&2) and red one

· CHECK THE MATCH REPORT

(CPO gives it before)

- ✓ Check names & numbers
- Reduction of the players to 8 and officials to 2
- ✓ Team official A has to sign it (of each team)

· CONTACT WITH THE TEAMS

- ✓ Explain "FAIR-PLAY" sense
- ✓ Clarify any doubt
- ✓ Check the Teams have the

" CARD REFEREE PERFORMANCE"

SECURITY PROCEDURE

- EHF promotes the objective at all levels the promotion of FAIR PLAY in all events.
- The protection of those participating in competitions, players, coaches, media workers, spectators..., is a key concern.
- All local organisers have full responsibility for the conduct of the competition including all the safety and security measures.
- · Measures to be taken:
 - Checking of the quality and tribunes fixation,
 - The capacity of the playing courts is not exceeded the number of seats
 - Have a safety and security plan and paramedical service

SECURITY PROCEDURE

- Escape routes, passageways and stairs shall be kept free of any obstacle sand spectators
- Entrances and exits as well as escape routes shall be clearly marked.
- The official announcer shall comply with the instructions issued by the EHF delegate and local organiser. Only announcements of neutral content may be made.
- An adequate number of first aid staff shall be available. First aid personal shall be easy to identify.
- In certain events strategic deployment of police forces is required inside and outside the playing court, and also for the control of the entrance area.

DURING THE GAME

Co-operation with Time Keeper and Secretary
 (The delegate has to be seated in the middle)

 Check with the table the number of points given by the referees

 Supervise the substitution area and the behaviour of the players and officials

DURING THE GAME

- Establish the co-operation visual line with the referees
- Make notes to fill in the match report:
 - · Referees performance
 - Table co-operation
 - · Officials and players behaviour
- · Control the playing time
- · Control the score board

AFTER THE MATCH

- Receive the team's opinion about the referees performance (How many points)
- Review the match report and sign it by the delegate and referees
- · Bring it to the EHF TM
- · Have the meeting with the referees

DURING THE TOURNAMENT

 Discussion, Co-operation and meeting with referees and officials

· Co-operation with local organisers in order to improve the event performance

TIMEKEEPER

· Control the time (playing time & T.T.O)

· Whistle for:

- T.T.O (Check regularly the potential demand of the team in front of the table)
- The end of the playing time
- · Co-operation with the referees and delegate
- · Control the substitutions

SCOREKEEPER

- Take notes about points and suspensions
- Contact with referees during the match about the number of points
- Comment all the incident of the game (score, points, suspending players, ...)

SCOREKEEPER

· Control the suspensions (card 1,2 & red)

· Fill in the match report (see model)

· Co-operation with the referees and delegate

HOW MANAGING A PROTEST

- Protest are not allowed against:
 - Date and Time, venue and draw of the match
 - ✓ Nominations of referees and delegate
 - ✓ Referees' decision on facts in accordance with Beach Handball rules
 - ✓ Results of matches

HOW MANAGING A PROTEST

· PROCEDURE:

- Protests shall be announced to the EHF delegate orally after end of the match
- The reason of the protest shall be handed over in writing within 30 min after the end of the match. At the same time a protest fee of 400€ has to be paid. If the protest is granted the deposit will be refund it.
- ✓ The EHF Disciplinary Commission takes its
 decision by simple majority 1h before the
 start of the next match team concerned
- ✓ All decisions taken by the Disciplinary Commission (1st and 2nd instance) are final decisions

HANDLING THE MATCH REPORT

- The EHF in co-operation with the local organiser, shall prepare the match report with the player names (Maximum 10) and the officials (Maximum 4) nominated for the competition
 - It is the responsibility of the first listed team official on the match report to reduce the number of listed players to a maximum of 8
 - The match report has to be completed 30 min before of the beginning of the game
