



### 30 questions to EHF Delegates:

1. A5 is suspended for the second time just before the end of the game. A "Golden Goal" situation will follow:
  - a) A5 is not eligible to play
  - b) A5 can play after a change of ball possession (turnover) between the two teams
  - c) A5 can only play if the "Shoot-Out" situation comes into existence.
  - d) A5 can be replaced
