

- How to manage difficult situation?
- Learning capacity - be able to take critics
- Leadership - unpopular decisions

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Cooperation among team officials, players and referees



- By being constructive :coaches, players need (sometimes) explanation
- By being flexible :overlook minor infringements, reaction in complex situation !
- By selling your decision: body language, behaviour, "policeman"



How do the referees fulfil the coach/player expectation ?



- Being prepared: be visible and show that the respective game is important for you
- Look professional: present of yourself as a personality
- Referees and authority : set clear criteria and consistency in refereeing
- Accepting criticisms !
