Handball at School: Main resources in Handball - the schools.

- 90% of involved NFs have connections to schools
 In 90% of the schools handball is part of the curriculum
- Around 35.000 school teams

Front runners: FRA – 18.000

GER - 7.660

Only app. 25% of the schools are really teaching/practising handball !!! These figures lead to the conclusion that mainly schools with tradition in handball or handball focused schools (based on personal initiatives) are doing an excellent job and have good contacts to their NFs



How to increase the number of schools really teaching/practising Handball?



Youth Handball: Focused on offering adequate games combined with fun, life time sport activities and education concerning fair play, ethics and morals in sport and social life.

Total number of players: 920.000

Front runners: FRA - 274.000, GER - 344.000

Total number of teams: 70.000

- All NFs organise competitions for the youth teams
- The internal structure is mostly well developed (90%)
- 80% have coaches for each category

These figures could lead to the statement that youth handball is on the right way

Question:

How to increase the popularity of our sport in the younger age categories?



Beach Handball: Simple structure, few restrictions and little administration, easy rules. Sun, fun, lifestyle and handball.

Beach Handball activities: Yes: 23 (77%), No: 7

• Total number of players: 40.000

 More than 500 players in detail: 7 (AUT, CZE, GER, HUN, NED, NOR, SWE)

Front runners: **GER – 15.000, SWE – 12.000**

90% of the NFs agree with EHF Beach Handball activities EBT, EChs These figures show that Beach Handball has a wide base in Europe
