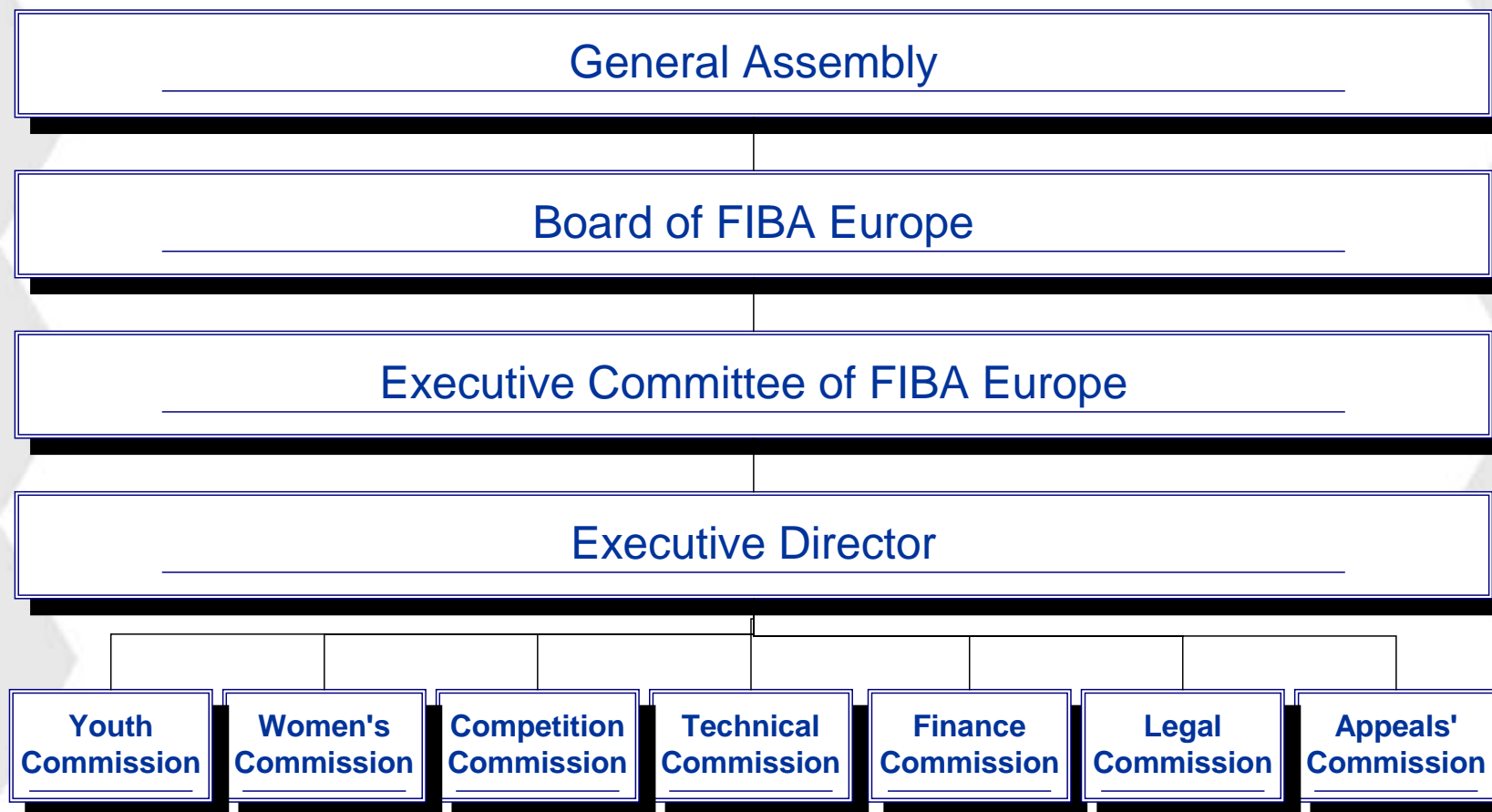


Introduction

Referees

Structure Referees FIBA Europa:

102. QUALIFICATION AND APPOINTMENT

102.1. General provisions

Each national federation affiliated to FIBA Europe has the right to choose the candidates for the title of international referee from amongst its best national referees. A national federation may have an unlimited number of international referees. However, it may propose a maximum of 2 international referee candidates per year.

102.2. FIBA international referee candidates

In order to obtain the title of FIBA international referee the candidates must:

1. Be proposed officially by their national federation.
2. Have officiated in the country's top competitions (men and/or women) for a minimum of 2 (two) years.
3. Have reached his/her age of 25th birthday in the year of the clinic.
4. Be aged 35 or under in the year of the clinic.
5. Participate in an FIBA international referee candidates' clinic.
6. Pass a theoretical and a practical examination, as well as a physical aptitude test.
Only the official tests and examinations established by the Technical Commission of FIBA are valid.
7. Clinics are organised by the Technical Commission of FIBA Europe with the assistance of the Offices of FIBA. The Technical Commission of FIBA Europe may impose an age limit on international referees.

Referees



Main Duties

The main duties of international referees are as follows

- To represent FIBA Europe on the court.
- To be responsible for the application of the Official Basketball Rules.
- To co-operate with the organisers to ensure the smooth running of the game.
- To make certain that the interests of all of the teams are in no way encroached.
- To inspect and approve all of the equipment to be used during the given game.
- To designate the official game clock, 24-second device and recognise the table officials as such.

Referees



Main Duties

- Not to permit any player to wear objects which may cause injury.
- To have the power to make decisions on any point not specifically covered by the basketball rules.
- To have the power to stop the game when conditions warrant it.
- To examine the score sheet at the end of the playing time or at any time when necessary
- If deemed necessary to make a report on the game, this shall be done immediately after the end of the game and handed to the commissioner if present or send it directly to the Executive Director of FIBA Europe.

Selection

107.2. FIBA Commissioner candidates

In order to obtain the title of FIBA Commissioner the candidates must:

1. Be proposed officially by their national federation
2. Be 55 years or younger in the year of the clinic
3. The commissioners shall be selected from amongst the persons active in basketball
4. The commissioners must be fluent (understand, speak, read and write) in English. The commissioners must have sufficient knowledge of the Official Basketball Rules, the Regulations of FIBA Europe and Byelaws as well as the Internal Regulations of FIBA to be able to accomplish their mission.
5. Clinics are organised by the Technical Commission of FIBA Europe. The Technical Commission of FIBA Europe may impose an age limit on FIBA Europe commissioners.

Responsibilities

108.3. The commissioner shall be primarily responsible for the smooth running of the game.

The duties of the commissioner are as follows:

- Represent and act on behalf of FIBA Europe
- Ensure the full co-operation of referees, teams and organisers,
- Be responsible primarily for the smooth running of the scorers table,
- During the game be seated at the scorers table between the timekeeper and the scorer,
- If information is requested by the referees during or at the end of the game, he must supply such information but any final decision rests with the referees,

Commissioners



- Secure and distribute the respective copies of the score sheet to the teams,
- Ensure the transmission of results and statistics to the Offices of FIBA Europe immediately after the game
- Verify the FIBA Europe list of approved players, passports, FIBA Europe licences and uniform number of the players at the Technical Meeting with the teams,
- If necessary make a report of the game immediately after the end of the game and hand it to the President of the Technical Committee or the FIBA Europe Sports Director,
- Closely co-operate at any time with the FIBA Europe Sports Director
- During a championship, the commissioner must be appropriately dressed (i.e. he must obey a certain dress code)
- When on duty, he must wear a suit (preferably dark in colour), a shirt and a tie.
