# EHF Competitions Commission / Technical Refereeing Commitee

The Competition Commission (CC) has been part of the EHF structure since the foundation of the European Handball Federation in 1992. Back then, there was a Technical Commission dealing with all the technical matters in handball.

Due to the rapid development in handball, the Technical Commission soon split into two new commissions, the Competitions Commission and the Methods Commission. The responsibility of the CC is to deal with all the competitions matters of the EHF events, playing system of competitions and regulations based on the EHF Refereeing structure.

In order to guarantee high level refereeing all over the European handball courts, various programmes have been targeting referee- and delegate education with a special focus on young referees and female referees.

To take the subject to the next level, the EHF Executive Committee took a decision to set up a new specialised body. The EHF Technical Refereeing Committee (TRC) has been called into being to serve as a kind of think tank contributing to the further development of the European refereeing standards.

The EHF Technical Refereeing Committee held its first meeting on Friday, 9 January 2009 in the EHF Headquarters, Vienna.

The chairman of the committee is Sándor Andorka, responsible for refereeing matters within the EHF Competitions Commission. The members Carol Domenge (FRA), Jiri Konecny (CZE) and Dragan Nachevski (MKD) complete this committee.







## Course Basics

Based on a proposal by the EHF Technical Refereeing Committee (TRC) the EHF Competitions Commission (CC) suggested the organization of the 2010 EHF Referee Education Workshop to the EHF Technical Delegation (TD) that fixed the educational event for 2-4 July 2010 in Vienna/AUT.

After the 2005 EHF Referees' and Delegates' Convention the European Handball Federation (EHF) again invites all EHF Member Federations to nominate their chiefs of referees, respectively those responsible for referee education to Vienna for a common workshop that this time is mainly supposed to deal with referee education on a national level. The participants will have the chance to be interactively involved in discussions on the matter with their colleagues and shall finalize the framework concept of the EHF Guidelines for National Referee Education together with the attending EHF CC and TRC members. Special attention shall also be paid to the EHF Young Referee Programme as well as recruiting strategies for finding more women's referee couples.

Furthermore a very interesting contribution from FIBA Europe on basketball officiating with particular reference on the players' and coaches' behaviour is on the agenda as well as explanations on the new IHF Rules of the Game.
