EHF / EHF Competence Academy & Network (EHF CAN) - Organiser



The European Handball Federation (EHF) is the governing body of Handball in Europe! Its 50 Member Federations represent and stand for 50 different kinds of national and international handball know-how. Those individual national handball schools/philosophies shall be made use of by involving experts in order to contribute to the variety of handball education in Europe!

Handball know-how exchange and transfer in Europe shall be fostered as an EHF service for the EHF Member Federations by making use of national and international handball experts as well as external lecturers from sport science, medicine, other sports, economy (marketing, equipment suppliers) and media (press, TV, Internet).

The EHF Competence Academy & Network (EHF CAN) shall be established as an educational service centre for EHF Member Federations with the possibility of granting scholarships in order to minimize or delete financial burdens for them. The same holds good for internal EHF Office management training on the job.

The EHF "CAN" shall be established to develop and deliver sport specific educational and training programmes in order to ensure that coaches, officials, athletes and administrators from all over Europe (and the world) have access to the highest quality education relating to "handball know-how" and competence in e-learning, blended learning, interdisciplinary educational courses of various duration, summer schools or mainstream 2-4 semester courses within the European Education Credit Transfer System (ECTS framework).

The EHF "CAN" shall set-up Business Executive Education programmes for further educating and training sporting administrators, resort managers and event executives in the Handball Event Management Business, e.g. also in event-related courses.

The EHF "CAN" shall contain a documentation centre including production of modern teaching aids and media as well as cooperation agreements with research&developing partners, suppliers, universities and testifying institutions.



Course Basics

The 2011 EHF "Rinck" Convention Seminar for Signatory Nations will take place at the European Handball Federation (EHF) Office in Vienna /AUT from February the 11th – 12th 2011. The course is part of the 2011 EHF Methods Commision activity plan and will be organized in cooperation with the EHF Competence Academy Network.

The course participants will represent the 21 Rinck Convention signatories AUT, BUL, CRO, CZE, DEN, ESP, FRA, GER, HUN, ITA, LUX, MNE, NOR, POL, POR, RUS, SLO, SVK, SWE, SUI and TUR.

Who should attend

The EHF seminar is open for attendance for Rinck Convention signatory nation representatives nominated by their national federations. The nominated participants shall work in the area of coaching education in their National Federations.

Finances

Cost for full board and lodging for all participants as well as cost resulting form infrastructure (e.g. conference room rent) will be borne by the EHF.

Travel costs have to be borne by the participants themselves. The same holds good for the cost for local transfers from and to the airport or railway station.

Seminar Philosophy & Objectives

Although a "traditional RINCK Convention seminar" was not held in 2010, work did not cease on the venture. An administrative workshop – initiated by the Methods Commission was undertaken with responsible persons where varying points of interest were discussed, mainly resulting from the outcome of the 2009 EHF RINCK Convention seminars for both signatories and non-signatories.

This and other issues led the EHF MC to initiate contact among the signatory nations and present them with various proposals, and based on high percentage of positive feedback, the educational programme was restructured from a 5 level to a 4 level educational framework. Naturally, the changes are compatible with the EU educational requirements and framework established by ENSSEE (European Network Sport Science Education Employment) in accordance with the "Bologna" Process.

Within the framework of the 10th EHF Congress, 24 – 25 September 2010 in Copenhagen the signatories' nations received the respective documentation to the restructuring of the RC and on the same occasion, a formal signing confirmation took place as Luxembourg (as a new member) and Russia (continuing membership after an intermission period) were welcomed to the RINCK Convention, now consisting of 21 EHF Member Federations. All in all, the RINCK Convention has certified 123 Master Coaches and continues to support freedom of movement for handball coaches in Europe.

Therefore the declared objectives of the 2011 EHF RINCK Convention Seminar for signatories are:

- to find ways of encouraging and assisting non-signatories to join the RINCK Convention for the sake of a coherent development of coaches' education in all EHF Member Federations
- as the introduction of an EHF licensing system might by an option for the future, the 2010 edition of RINCK Convention should be elaborated on with a focus on potentially conflicting provisions and the legal possibility of implementation
