




What is not permitted?

- pull or hit the ball out of the hands of an opponent
- block or force away an opponent with arms, hands or legs
- restrain, hold, push, run or jump into an opponent
- interfere with, impede or endanger an opponent







Progressive punishment also applies in the case of unsportsmanlike conduct.






A player who endangers the opponent"s health when attacking him, shall be disqualified, particularly if he:

• from the side or from behind, either strikes or pulls back the throwing arm of a player who is in the process of throwing or passing the ball




- takes any action resulting in the opponent being struck on the head or neck
- deliberately hits the body of an opponent with his foot or knee or in any other way; this includes tripping





• pushes an opponent who is running or jumping, or attacks him in such a way that the opponent loses control of his body; this also applies when a goalkeeper leaves his goal area in connection with a counterattack from the opponents





• hits a defending player in the head with a free-throw taken as a direct shot on goal, assuming that the defending player was not moving; or similarly, hits the goalkeeper in the head with a 6-meter throw, assuming that the goalkeeper was not moving.



The rules say:

- Suspension
- Suspension + Red card
- Exclusion

But the best referees use their PERSONALITY

- Personal behaviour
- Progressive behaviour
- Progressive punishment





- 1. Move, eyes (personal contact)
- 2. "Hello, Hey" (personal contact & copy)
- Whistle hard (personal contact & copy)
- 4. Verbal caution
 - Whistle harder
 - MOVE to the situation
 - Personal contact and "That's the line!"





- 5. Suspension (warning in indoor handball is for sure suspension in BH)
 - Whistle
 - Move
 - Personal contact
 - Clear signs to the player and table
- •SMARTNESS
 - •Find your LINE, and do not leave it
 - •But can be SMART to give a suspended player a hard WHISTLE and a strong eye contact, before the 2nd suspension





- 6. 2nd Suspension
 - TIME OUT & Show clearly the Red card
 - Don't re-start before everything is OK
 - Use the time, show your control without arrogance
- 7. Red card
 - •"Pink" indoor is CLEARLY RED in BH





- 8. Exclusion
 - Spitting
 - Throwing sand
 - Hitting

The <u>BEST referees</u> follow their progressive line and:

•Give a direct suspension, direct disqualification or exclusion when it is necessary
