Hosting City - Drammen, Norway

Facts about the City

Drammen, the River City, is located 40 kilometers west of Oslo. Drammen has more than 64,000 inhabitants, but the city serves as a regional centre for an area with a population of about 150,000. Drammen is a city of diversity and 20 percent of the population have immigrant background, a fact which leaves its colourful mark on the cityscape.

History

The city of Drammen was founded in 1811 as the two towns Strømsø and Bragernes were united. The city shield was originally created in 1715. It says "In fide et justitia fortitudo" (From faith and justice comes strength). The old part of the city hall was sketched by Nils S. Eckhoff and was built in 1871.

Geography

The total area of Drammen is 145.2 square kilometres, including 9.5 square kilometres of lakes and rivers, 15.8 square kilometres of farming land and 89.9 square kilometres of forest. The population is approximately 64,000 (2011), which makes Drammen the 9th biggest city in Norway. Drammen is located in the county of Buskerud, 40 kilometers and 35 minutes south-west of Oslo.

Attractions

Aass Brewery: It is the oldest surviving brewery in Norway, and has won acclaim for both its beer and its conservative building. Founded in 1834, the brewery's primary products are soft drinks, beer and aquavit.

Bridges: Drammen City Bridge (Drammensbrua bybro) - concrete bridge which connects the two centers of the town, built 1936 / Drammen Bridge (Drammensbrua) - motorway box girder bridge on E18 that crosses Drammenselva, built 1971 / Ypsilon bridge (Ypsilon bru) - cable-stayed bridge over Drammenselva, built 2007

Drammen Museum: Drammen Museum of Art and Cultural History includes the Marienlyst farm, a manor house from approx. 1770, museum building from 1930 with the museum's administration, permanent exhibitions and collections, and Lyche pavilion from 1990 with the gallery, temporary exhibitions and museum café, Halling yard, with 5 old buildings, the oldest from 1760's. The museum also includes the two largest preserved like farms in Drammen, Gulsbogen Manor and Austad farm.

Drammen Theater: Drammen Theater in Bragernes was built in 1869 and was designed by architect Emil Victor Langlet. The theater was the first modern theater in the country. It was designed in a complex Renaissance style with symmetrical facades and round arched windows. After Drammen Theater suffered total destruction by fire in December 1993, a new theater was rebuilt on the model of the original house. It was finished during February 1997.



EHF Competitions Commission / Technical Refereeing Committee

The Competition Commission (CC) has been part of the EHF structure since the foundation of the European Handball Federation in 1992. Back then, there was a Technical Commission dealing with all the technical matters in handball.

Due to the rapid development in handball, the Technical Commission soon split into two new commissions, the Competitions Commission and the Methods Commission. The responsibility of the CC is to deal with all the competitions matters of the EHF events, playing system of competitions and regulations based on the EHF Refereeing structure.

The CC includes a Chairman and four other members elected by the Congress with specific fields of activity, such as men's competitions, women's competitions, club competitions and last but not least refereeing.

In order to guarantee high level refereeing all over the European handball courts, various programmes have been targeting referee- and delegate education with a special focus on young referees and female referees.

To take the subject to the next level, the EHF Executive Committee made a decision to set up a new specialised body. The EHF Technical Refereeing Committee (TRC) has been called into being to serve as a kind of think tank contributing to the further development of the European refereeing standards.

The EHF Technical Refereeing Committee held its first meeting on Friday, 9 January 2009 in the EHF Headquarters, Vienna.

The present chairman of the committee is Dragan Nachevski (MKD), responsible for refereeing matters within the EHF Competitions Commission.



EHF / EHF Competence Academy & Network (EHF CAN)



The European Handball Federation (EHF) is the governing body of Handball in Europe! Its 50 Member Federations represent and stand for 50 different kinds of national and international handball know-how. Those individual national handball schools/philosophies shall be made use of by involving experts in order to contribute to the variety of handball education in Europe!

Handball know-how exchange and transfer in Europe shall be fostered as an EHF service for the EHF Member Federations by making use of national and international handball experts as well as external lecturers from sport science, medicine, other sports, economy (marketing, equipment suppliers) and media (press, TV, Internet).

The EHF Competence Academy & Network (EHF CAN) has been established as an educational service centre for EHF Member Federations with the possibility of granting scholarships in order to minimize or delete financial burdens for them. The same holds good for internal EHF Office management training on the job.

The EHF “CAN” has been established to develop and deliver sport specific educational and training programmes in order to ensure that coaches, officials, athletes and administrators from all over Europe (and the world) have access to the highest quality education relating to “handball know-how” and competence in e-learning, blended learning, interdisciplinary educational courses of various duration, summer schools or mainstream 2-4 semester courses within the European Education Credit Transfer System (ECTS framework).

The EHF “CAN” has set-up Business Executive Education programmes for further educating and training sporting administrators, resort managers and event executives in the Handball Event Management Business, e.g. also in event-related courses.

The EHF “CAN” contains a documentation centre including production of modern teaching aids and media as well as cooperation agreements with research&developing partners, suppliers, universities and testifying institutions.

EHF Candidates will be appointed to referee games at the Scandinavian Open Tournament (women's born 1994).

Finances

Curriculum of EHF Referee Candidate Educational Courses

1. Organisation: EHF in cooperation with National Federations as local organisers (High level handball tournament/games obligatory)

2. Type: course for EHF referee candidates nominated by National Federations (based on the EHF Structure of Refereeing)

3. Course lecturers/administrators:
3-lecturers from CC (refereeing and coaching) and EHF Lecturer Staff
1-2 administrators from EHF Office/EHF CAN

4. Duration: 5-7 days

5. Language: English

6. Entry Criteria (To be forwarded to the EHF office staff member during the event):

A copy of the passport.

A handball CV of the candidate(s).

Medical attest of max. 1 month old.

A summary of the physical tests and the results signed as a true statement by the chief-referee

7. Basic requirements:

a) Physical conditions (Shuttle run test)*

b) Theoretical knowledge (IHF Rules, EHF Regulations etc.)*

c) Language: Ability to communicate in English*

d) Ability to manage a match on the highest national level in a sufficient way*

e) Ability to learn "on the job" and to improve

f) Realistic view on his/her actual level of competence and the domains of competency which have to be improved.(realistic objectives)

* If the referees do clearly not meet with the above requirements, a share of the course costs will be refunded via their national federation.
