The EHF Policy

You are a representative of the EHF and of HANDBALL

- secure a fair and spectacular game
- be polite and friendly – **but also strict if necessary**
- study preparatory papers
- report on incidents
- evaluate marketing and TV situation (exc. marketing DEL)
- keep an eye on the image of handball and the EHF
- use the EHF tool kit for assistance



The EHF Policy

You have to secure the organisation of the matches

- refer to national legislation and international regulations
- take care of safety and security
- claims for damages have to be made towards the organiser, info EHF
- measures depend on circumstances – be active, analyse the situation

You have to observe the referees – details later

You have to have certain qualities

- availability and neutrality
- competence
- personality
- discretion
- stress resistance
- experience
- communication – language knowledge
