EHF / EHF Competence Academy & Network (EHF CAN)

The European Handball Federation (EHF) is the governing body of Handball in Europe! Its 50 Member Federations represent and stand for 50 different kinds of national and international handball know-how. Those individual national handball schools/philosophies shall be made use of by involving experts in order to contribute to the variety of handball education in Europe!

Handball know-how exchange and transfer in Europe shall be fostered as an EHF service for the EHF Member Federations by making use of national and international handball experts as well as external lecturers from sport science, medicine, other sports, economy (marketing, equipment suppliers) and media (press, TV, Internet).

The EHF Competence Academy & Network (EHF CAN) shall be established as an educational service centre for EHF Member Federations with the possibility of granting scholarships in order to minimize or delete financial burdens for them. The same holds good for internal EHF Office management training on the job.

The EHF "CAN" shall be established to develop and deliver sport specific educational and training programmes in order to ensure that coaches, officials, athletes and administrators from all over Europe (and the world) have access to the highest quality education relating to "handball know-how" and competence in e-learning, blended learning, interdisciplinary educational courses of various duration, summer schools or mainstream 2-4 semester courses within the European Education Credit Transfer System (ECTS framework).

The EHF "CAN" shall set-up Business Executive Education programmes for further educating and training sporting administrators, resort managers and event executives in the Handball Event Management Business, e.g. also in event-related courses.

The EHF "CAN" shall contain a documentation centre including production of modern teaching aids and media as well as cooperation agreements with research&developing partners, suppliers, universities and testifying institutions.

Course Basics

The 2015 EHF "RINCK" Convention will take place at the European Handball Federation (EHF) Office in Vienna (Austria) from February the 13th- 14th 2015. The course is part of the 2015 EHF Methods Commission activity plan and will be organized in cooperation with the EHF Competence Academy Network (EHF CAN).

30 course participants out of 37 "RINCK" Convention Signatories will represent their countries: AUT, BLR, BUL, CRO, CZE, DEN, ENG, ESP, EST, FIN, FRA, GER, HUN, IRL, ISL, ITA, LAT, LTU, MKD, NED, NOR, POL, POR, ROU, RUS, SLO, SVK, SUI, SWE and TUR, as well as the EHF RINCK Convention Non- Signatory guests from BEL.

Who should attend?

The EHF seminar is open for attendance for "RINCK" Convention signatory nation representatives nominated by their national federations. The nominated participants shall work in the area of coaching education in their National Federations.

Finances

Cost for full board and lodging for all participants as well as cost resulting form infrastructure (e.g. conference room rent) will be borne by the EHF.

Travel costs have to be borne by the participants themselves. The same holds good for the cost for local transfers from and to the airport or railway station.

Seminar Philisophy & Objectives

The two years since 2013, when the last "RINCK" Convention Seminar took place, have abounded with numerous undertakings that influenced successfully the operation of the venture. The ideas and plans presented on the mentioned Seminar in 2013 have been improved and put into practice with the significant support of signatories.

Special efforts of the EHF Methods Commission concerning the expansion of the "RINCK" Convention members' have been very successful. As a result, the EHF "RINCK" Convention signatories group welcomes new participants- the national federations of Finland, Greece, Israel, Malta, FYR Macedonia, as well as the already adopted applicant-Lithuania. The "RINCK" Convention consists of 37 EHF Member Federations.

Regarding the development of the educational process proposed at the 2013 EHF "RINCK" Convention Seminar, the second 'EHF Open Master Coach and Licensing Course' was finalised in Gyor/ HUN in December 2014. Following the EHF 2012-2016 master plan the next edition of the 'EHF Open Master Coach and Licensing Course' shall take place in the year 2016, under the same structure- three modules and individual theses to be produced and defended by the participants. The system will be administered by the EHF by means of an EHF database in close cooperation with the National Federations that are EHF RC signatory countries.

Therefore, the declared objectives of the 2015 EHF "RINCK" Convention Seminar for Signatory Nations are:

- to acquaint the signatories with the standards and curriculum of new educational targets, namely:
- EHF Open Master Coach and Licensing Courses
- National Master Coach and Licensing Courses
- EHF PRO Licence and EHF Coaching Licence
- Expansion of EHF "RINCK" Convention
- to discuss the contribution of the participants, especially national targets, ways to implement, regional solutions, further perspectives
