What the rules say:

- ➤ 14:1 A 6-meter throw is awarded when:
- a) a clear chance of scoring is destroyed anywhere on the court by a player or a team official of the opposing team.



- b) there is an unwarranted whistle signal at the time of a clear chance of scoring.
- c) a clear chance of scoring is destroyed through the interference of someone not participating in the game (except when Rule 9:1, Comment, applies).









A "clear chance of scoring" exists when:

- a) a player who already has ball and body control at the goal-area line
- b) a player who has ball and body control in a counterattack,
- c) a player is in a situation which corresponds to (a) or (b) above, except that the player does not yet control ball but is ready for an immediate reception of the ball;
- d) a goalkeeper has left his goal area and an opponent with ball and body control has a clear and unimpeded opportunity to throw the ball into the empty goal;





How to take the right decisions?

- ✓ If attacker has ball and body under control NO 6 meter.
- ✓ No any opponent between attacker and goalkeeper.
- ✓ Facing to the opponent goal and shooting chance.
- ✓ The line referee must anticipate the situation and watch where the feet of the defenders are before the collision!
- ✓ Also, standing on the line is not reason for a 6meter.
- ✓ The rule says that 6-meter is for destroying a clear scoring chance.



When to award 6 meter throw?

6:2 When a court player enters the goal area, the decisions shall be as follows:
c) 6 meter throw, when a defending player enters the goal area and, because of this, destroys a clear chance of scoring (Rule 14:1a).

14:1 A 6-meter throw is awarded when: a) a clear chance of scoring is destroyed anywhere on the court by a player or a team official of the opposing team





- ✓ If a clear scoring chance is destroyed because of such an interruption, when it is caused by an infringement on the part of the defending team, then a 6-metre throw shall be awarded in accordance with Rule 14:1a.
- ✓ If a referee or delegate (from the IHF or a Continental/National Federation) interrupts the game at a moment when the team in possession has a clear chance of scoring, 6-metre shall be awarded (14.1a)







- ✓ there is an unwarranted whistle signal at the time of a clear chance of scoring,
- ✓ a clear chance of scoring is destroyed through the interference of someone not participating in the game.
- ✓ If during a Shoot-out or fast break the defending goalkeeper or player obstructs the running path of the attacking player, causing a physical contact, both a 6-metre throw and a suspension or a disqualification shall be awarded (clarification No.9).







How to draw up a good line for that?



- ✓ It is good for the referees to have a common line. The line referee has to be very careful on 6 M:
- If attacker player took advantage going inside the 6M,
 - If defenders players push the others.
- Both referees help each other for the aggressive fouls.
