EHF REFEREEING

- For a long time there were no substantial changes
- In July 2016 the IHF has changed 5 rules.









OLD' RULES

- Passive play
- Pivot play
- 7 m decision
- Disqualification & 2 min. suspension
- Offensive foul
- Wing play





NEW RULES 2016

- Goalkeeper as a player
- Injured player
- Passive play
- Last minute
- Blue card





GOALKEEPER - PLAYER

• The goalkeeper may be used as a 7th field player.









GOALKEEPER – PLAYER COACHES' POINT OF VIEW

- You can use this new rule as a tactical concept:
 - when you have one player less (2 minutes suspension)
 - when you want to play 7 against 6
- You have to be aware of:
 - fast contra attack
 - throw from goalkeeper





GOALKEEPER – PLAYER COACHES' POINT OF VIEW

Consequences for training:

- fast change (running) goalkeeper for extra player
- it has to be clear to all players who has to come out for the goalkeeper (player who comes in also comes out/player nearby substitution area)
- it has to become part of daily training (tactical)





INJURED PLAYER

 An injured player should leave the playing court after receiving medical care on the court and can only re-enter after the 3rd attack of his team is complete.











INJURED PLAYER COACHES' POINT OF VIEW

- No longer players stay on the ground for no reason (theatrics)
- Players will help each other to get up faster

Consequences:

- Actual playing time

EHIF CALL



PASSIVE PLAY

 After showing the forewarning signal the team forewarned has a total of 6 passes to shoot on goal.







PASSIVE PLAY COACHES' POINT OF VIEW

 Finally it is clear how many passes you can give after passive play. In the past there was no clear rule about passive play. It was alway the interpretation of the referees. No referee whistle the same.

Consequences:

- Referees have an important job in counting the passes



LAST MINUTE

 In some rules (8:5, 8:6, 8:10d) last minute of the game should be replaced by last 30 seconds of the game.







LAST MINUTE COACHES' POINT OF VIEW

- No comment
- I agree





BLUE CARD

 The referees have a blue card in addition to yellow and red to give more clarity regarding disqualification of a player.













BLUE CARD COACHES' POINT OF VIEW

- This rule gives more clarity during the match to coaches and players after a red card is given by the referees.
- In the past you always had to wait till after the game to know if the red card had consequences.





IMPORTANT THINGS FOR ME AS A COACH

- Communication between coach and referees
- Communication
 between players and
 referees
- Clear (hand)signals







IMPORTANT THINGS FOR ME AS A COACH

How can we develop ourselfs as a referee, player, coach:

- Being physically fit
- Being mentally fit
- Good preparation for each match
- Being capable to switch during a match
- Being capable to evaluate after a match
