The European Handball Federation (EHF) is the governing body of Handball in Europe! Its 50 Member Federations represent and stand for 50 different kinds of national and international handball know-how. Those individual national handball schools/philosophies shall be made use of by involving experts in order to contribute to the variety of handball education in Europe!

Handball know-how exchange and transfer in Europe shall be fostered as an EHF service for the EHF Member Federations by making use of national and international handball experts as well as external lecturers from sport science, medicine, other sports, economy (marketing, equipment suppliers) and media (press, TV, Internet).

The EHF Competence Academy & Network (EHF CAN) shall be established as an educational service centre for EHF Member Federations with the possibility of granting scholarships in order to minimize or delete financial burdens for them. The same holds good for internal EHF Office management training on the job.

The EHF "CAN" shall be established to develop and deliver sport specific educational and training programmes in order to ensure that coaches, officials, athletes and administrators from all over Europe (and the world) have access to the highest quality education relating to "handball know-how" and competence in e-learning, blended learning, interdisciplinary educational courses of various duration, summer schools or mainstream 2-4 semester courses within the European Education Credit Transfer System (ECTS framework).

The EHF "CAN" shall set-up Business Executive Education programmes for further educating and training sporting administrators, resort managers and event executives in the Handball Event Management Business, e.g. also in event-related courses.

The EHF "CAN" shall contain a documentation centre including production of modern teaching aids and media as well as cooperation agreements with research&developing partners, suppliers, universities and testifying institutions.

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Course Basics

The 2017 EHF "RINCK" Convention will take place at the Gartenhotel Altmannsdorf in Vienna (Austria) from February the 9th- 10th 2017. The course is part of the 2017 EHF Methods Commission activity plan and will be organised in cooperation with the EHF Competence Academy Network (EHF CAN).

38 course participants out of 38 "RINCK" Convention Signatories will represent their countries: AUT, BLR, BEL, BUL, CRO, CYP, DEN, ENG, EST, FIN, FRA, GER, GRE, HUN, IRL, ISL, ITA, LAT, LTU, LUX, MKD, MLT, MNE, NED, NOR, POL, POR, ROU, RUS, SLO, SRB, SUI, SVK, SWE and TUR.

Who should attend?

The EHF seminar is open for attendance for "RINCK" Convention signatory nation representatives nominated by their national federations. The nominated participants shall work in the area of coaching education in their National Federations.

Finances

Cost for full board and lodging for all participants (1 representative/Federation) as well as cost resulting from infrastructure (e.g. conference room rent) will be borne by the EHF.

Travel costs have to be borne by the participants themselves. The same holds good for the cost for local transfers from and to the airport or railway station.

Seminar Philisophy & Objectives

The two years since 2015, when the last "RINCK" Convention Seminar took place, have abounded with numerous undertakings that successfully influenced the operation of the venture. The ideas and plans presented in the mentioned Seminar in 2015 have been improved and put into practice with the significant support of signatories.

Special efforts of the EHF Methods Commission concerning the expansion of the "RINCK" Convention members' have been very successful. The "RINCK" Convention consists of 38 EHF Member Federations.

Regarding the development of the educational process proposed at the 2013 EHF "RINCK" Convention Seminar, the third 'EHF Open Master Coach and Licensing Course' was finalised in Gothenburg / SWE in December 2016. Following the 2 year EHF Master Coach Course rhythm, the next edition of the 'EHF Open Master Coach and Licensing Course' shall take place in the year 2018, under the same structure- three modules and individual theses to be produced and defended by the participants.

The EHF Coaching Licensing system for EHF competitions on level 3 already started in the season 2014/25. It is administered by the EHF by means of an EHF database in close cooperation with the National Federations that are EHF RC signatory countries.

Therefore, the declared objectives of the 2017 EHF "RINCK" Convention Seminar for Signatory Nations are:

- to acquaint the signatories with the standards and curriculum of new educational targets, namely:
- EHF Open Master Coach and Licensing Courses
- National Master Coach and Licensing Courses
- EHF PRO Licence and EHF Coaching Licence- smooth transition to 2020
- Expansion of EHF "RINCK" Convention
- to discuss the contribution of the participants, especially national targets, ways to implement, regional solutions, further perspectives
