Progressive line What is it and why use it?

Progressive punishment means that it is not sufficient to penalize a particular foul solely with a free-throw or 6-meter throw, because the foul goes beyond the type of infraction which normally occurs in the struggle for the ball.

- WARNING → 2. SUSPENSION → 3. DISQUALIFICATION
 → 4. DISQUALIFICATION WITH REPORT
- To prevent serious fouls and unsportsmanlike conduct
- To keep the game clean and fair




Progressive line

How to build it?

•BODY LANGUAGE

- Gestures
- Facial expressions
- Body postures
- Use of the voice
- Strenght of the whistle
- PUNISHMENTS
- **•BE AND LOOK CONFIDENT, DIRECT, RELAXED**
 - Assertiveness, credibility, likeability
- Remember only 2x10 min playing time!





- Repeated fouls and unsportsmanlike conduct
- Repeated infractions of formal throw
- Faulty substitution
- Team officials violations

Free-throw / 6-meter-throw ... was there a clear scoring chance before the violation of rules?

Turnover






Disqualification

- Player who endangers the opponent's health when attacking him,
 shall be disqualified
 - Pushing from behind and side, pulling arms
 - Strucking on the head or neck
 - Hitting with foot or knee
 - ·Hitting of a defending player or goalkeeper in the head by the ball
 - Goalkeeper leaving the goal area

Loose of body control + Intention to play the ball






• "Even a foul with a very small physical impact can be very dangerous and have potentially very serious consequences, if the timing of the foul is such that opponent is defenseless and caught unaware. It is the risk to the player and not the seemingly minor nature of the body contact that should be guilding in determining the appropriateness of a disqualification."

Seriously unsportsmanlike conduct by a player or team official, on or outside the court

Second suspension of the same player






Assault

- Forceful and deliberate attack against the body of another person (player referee, timekeeper/ scorekeeper, team official, delegate, spectator etc).
- Not a reflex action or the result of careless and excessive methods.
- Spitting on another person is specifically regarded as assault.

DISQUALIFICATION WITH REPORT



Punishments – Special moments

- •The goalkeeper's behavior (in vs outside the goal area)
- Infractions outside the playing time
- More than one violation in the same situation
