What makes you a good BH referee?

- > Theoretical knowledge
- > Good physical preparation
- > Feeling of the game
- > Attitude
- > Good relationship with your partner
- Body language






- > Referees tasks:
- Equal authority, they should respect their own duties and each other
- Responsible for everything what happens on the court, before, during and after the match
- Responsibile for inspecting the court, the goals and the ball, check the score sheet, the equipment of the players before the match



> Before the game
> During the game

> Before the game

- \checkmark Be in time at the court
- ✓ Say "Hello" to the delegate, team officials, time/scorekeeper
- ✓ Warm up (get used with the sunlight, temperature, atmosphere)
- Coin toss and ask the teams to play fair
- Shake hands with the players and officials







> During the game

- Clear body language in every situation
- Focus at the game starting from the first second
- Good and clear progressive line
- ✓ Good cooperation with the delegates, time/scorekeeper
- ✓ Look nice and smile!









> After the game

- ✓ Shake hand with your partner, officials and players that come to you
- ✓ Take care of the match report
- ✓ Analyze the game with your partner, then with the delegate
- Talk with the players and/or officials about special events that happened during the game, if they ask you to







Which are the characteristics of a good referees?

- > Cleverness
- Good knowledge of the rules
- Confidence
- > Perseverance
- Positive attitude
- > Clear line
- Good advantage
- > Stay fit





What does the advantage means?

- A clause in the Rules of the Game that gives the referees the discretion to allow play to continue even after a foul has been committed if stopping play would unfairly punish the fouled team
- Look for advantage and if this doesn't appear, you can whistle later
- Respect the flow of the game, but never tolerate an advantage taken by violating the rules



How to apply the "advantage" correctly in BH?

- > Be as ,,invisible" as posible in the game!
- > Be present, but whistle only if it's necessary!
- > "feeling the game"- read the game, express your understanding of the game
- Express your leadership with clear line-same for both side. If you have a clear line from the beginning of the game, everybody will know what you allow and what not-take care that the game runs smoothly
 - We are in the game to EXPRESS, not to IMPRESS!
