

Innsbruck occupies a narrow site on a valley floor, hemmed in by mountains that seem to rise directly above it to the north and south, while the Inn River (the city takes its name from a bridge that spans it) flows west to east.

Its contemporary link with winter sports obscures Innsbruck's history and its association with the Habsburgs, particularly the Emperor Maximilian. Innsbruck was his favorite city and the Golden Roof, the landmark gilded loggia in the Old Town, or Altstadt, not far from the Inn River, is his creation, while the Hofburg, or imperial palace, is the work of Empress Maria Theresa.

Just south of the Alstadt, on the Maria-Theresien Strasse, the Triumphal Arch depicts the marriage of the Archduke Leopold to the Spanish infanta in 1765 on one side, and on the other, the death of the Emperor Francis I, Maria Theresa's husband, which happened at the same time.

This indeed seems like ancient history in a modern city dedicated to learning and pleasure. Innsbruck has a lively cultural life, and numerous bars, restaurants, cafes and pastry shops.

Concerts and other performances are staged year-round -- and in winter, the ball season is nearly as exhaustive as Vienna's.

In the mountains and outlying areas, there are scenic walking paths, and driving routes with various historical and artistic themes, including landmarks of

AUSTRIA Maximilian's life and of Austrian Gothic,
Baroque and Rococo ck's architecture.

And then there is the skiing.
Innsbruck's mountains, while
not very high (up to 7,687 feet),
generally guarantee good snow
from early December through mid-April.





Course Basics

The 8th EHF Regional course for Handball Delegates takes place in Innsbruck/AUT from 19 – 22 March 2008 and is open for a maximum of 35 persons at a "first come, first served" basis It is scheduled around a 4 Men's Nation Tournament organized by the AUT Handball Federationwith the national teams of AUT, GER, SWE and TUN.

Who should attend

Within the EHF Regional Delegate Course Programme the course in Innsbruck/AUT is the penultimate chance for registered EHF delegates, who have not attended any delegates' course in the past seasons, to take part in that kind of obligatory EHF educational service in the 2007/2008 season

The last EHF Course for Handball Delegates will take place in the period April – June, 2008, most probably in the northern or eastern part of Europe.

Please bear in mind that EHF delegates, who will not attend any EHF Course for Handball Delegates by the end of 2007/2008 season, are not eligible to be registered by their respective National Federation as EHF delegate for the 2008/2009 season.

Therefore it is within the responsibility of the National Federations to exactly evaluate the situation of each EHF delegate regarding the participation in one of the two courses — either in Innsbruck/AUT from March 19-22, 2008 or the second course, which is still to be defined. It goes without saying that as soon as we have decided on a location for the last course all parties involved will be informed in writing.

Finances

Following the EHF course concept the cost for local transfers from the airport or railway station shall be borne by the organiser.

Cost for full board and lodging for all participants as well as cost resulting from infrastructure (e.g. conference room rent) will be borne by the EHF.

Travel costs have to be borne by the participants themselves.
