The EHF Technical Commissions and their Educational Services

The scope of tasks of the EHF Technical Commissions, the Competitions Commission (CC), the Methods Commission (MC) and the Beach Handball Commission (BC) is laid down in the EHF Statutes.

Several **non-statutory advisory bodies** support the work of the Technical Commissions.

The chairmen of the Technical Commissions are represented in EHF Technical Delegation as well as in the EHF Competence Academy & Network (CAN) Advisory Board.

They shall coordinate commission activities and educational services in cooperation with the EHF Executive Committee and the EHF Office Business Group "Education&Development".

The 8th EHF Extraordinary Congress 2007 in "Rome/ITA voted in favour of introducing a Beach Handball Commission as an additional EHF Technical Commission to deal solely with the sport of Beach Handball.

It is subordinate to the Executive Committee, which may assign to it areas of authority and responsibility in addition to those laid down in EHF statutes and regulations




- The European Handball Federation (EHF) is the governing body of handball in Europe! Its 50 member federations represent and stand for 50 different kinds of national and international handball know-how and competence. It goes without saying that the unique national handball schools/philosophies shall preserve and by no means be replaced by a centralized, uniform and directive handball education!
- Handball research, know-how exchange and competence transfer in Europe shall be fostered as an EHF service for the EHF member federations by making use of national and international handball experts as well as external lecturers from sport science, medicine, other sports, economy (marketing, equipment suppliers), media (press, TV, Internet) and other team sports.











EHF CAN – The Objectives



The EHF CAN shall be regarded as an

- educational service centre for EHF Member Federations with subsidies and scholarships granted
- -educational service centre for EHF Officials'/Office management training on the job

The EHF CAN shall

- develop and deliver sport specific educational and training programmes
- ensure that coaches, officials, athletes and administrators from all over Europe have access to the highest quality education relating to "handball know-how" by offering competences in e-learning, blended learning, interdisciplinary courses of various duration, summer schools or mainstream 2-4 semester courses





I. Technique & Tactics

Basic movement with/without the ball	Set of movements carried out by a player on court.
Bouncing the ball	Rebounding the ball from the court.
Catching the ball	Take hold of the ball after a pass from another player.
Centre back (CB)	A player positioned largely around the midcourt who initiates the offensive play, shoots or tries to penetrate the defence; also called a "playmaker".
Changing direction	Altering the position towards which someone moves.
Court referee (CR)	Referee behind the attacking team watching for any defensive or offensive fouls by the court players or any possession violations.
Goal line referee (GR)	Referee on the outer goal line who watches for any violations and verifies if the ball completely crossed the goal line for a goal.
Goalkeeper	A player positioned inside the goalkeeping area who is – opposed to field players – allowed to use his legs.
Handling the ball	Dribbling, catching or passing the ball.
Left back (LB)	A player positioned on the left hand side of the middle back carrying out action in the second line of the attack.
Left-handed player	Player using and throwing with his left hand.
Left wing (LW)	A player positioned on the left side of the court
Line player (LP)	Playing position in attack. A player who is active largely around the six-metre line among the defenders; also called "pivot"
EHF Officials	There are up to five officials controlling and administering an EHF handball game: two referees, a timekeeper, a scorekeeper, an EHF observer and an EHF supervisor
Playing positions	The seven playing positions are: goalkeeper, left wing, left back, middle back, line player, right back and right wing.
Passing the ball	Throwing he ball to another player from the team
