

Hosting City Bratislava

even though Bratislava is one of the youngest capital cities in Europe, it is the site of more than two thousand years of history. With its rich tradition it can easily be compared to any major European city. The name of Bratislava first appeared on the map of

Europe in March 1919, and has

been its official name ever since. It was previously known also by the names of Pressburg, Pozsony or Prešpork.. Bratislava was always a multicultural city in which several languages were spoken. It was a model example of tolerance as it was home to various nationalities and cultures — Slovak, German, Hungarian, Jewish, Czech or Croatian.

Bratislava has been always the cultural city. In the past, giants of music like Mozart, Haydn, Beethoven, Rubinstein, and Hummel have written and performed in Prešpork, today Bratislava. The city visited Casanova, Edison and Jules Verne. Bratislava has more than 20 museums and 80 galleries. Each year, Bratislava holds many cultural events and festivals. Among the best-known are the Bratislava Music Festival in September and the Bratislava Jazz Days in October.

Bratislava is not just the political, but is also the cultural and sporting capital of Slovakia. There are a lot of opportunities how to spend a free time. Holiday and active sportsmen can use football and ice-hockey stadiums, swimming pools, tennis courts, fitness center, play-grounds and so on. Bratislava's location on the slopes of the Small Carpathian hills mean there is a wide

range of hiking opportunities within the city itself and in the surrounding area. Forested hillsides comprise almost one quarter of the city's area, so getting away from the traffic and bustle of the metropolis – even for just a short time – is easy.
