


A Look back to our Tasks.....

Before the match

- Did we take the match report from EHF office?
- Is the court free from any player's or official's properties?
- Did we check the court? The anchorage of the goals ?
- Did we check the number of players , officials and balls on the court before the beginning of the match?



Before the match

- Did we check the player's equipment?
- Are all needed things on the table? Reserve clock, suspension cards etc.?
- If all is in order it is time to have some conversation with the team officials about "fair play" and to clarify any point of discussion.




During the match

- Which areas are in our main competence?
- Do we have to cooperate with the timekeeper and scorekeeper?
- Do we have to check the regular development of the match report?
- Establish a visual contact with the referees for a better cooperation during the match



During the match

- Take brief notes about the referees' behaviour and rule knowledge, they will be useful for the discussion after the match
- Do we have to check the running time as well?
- Who is responsible for the correct scoring and playing time?
- Do we have to whistle the end of the periods?



After the match

- Have we received the opinion of team officials about the referees' performance and taken it down on the "referees' performance sheet"?
- Have we checked the correct run down of the official match report?
- Did all the officials sign it (team officials, referees, timekeeper, scorekeeper, delegate)?
- What do I have to do with it now?



After the match

- The match report has been taken back to the CPO , what is our final duty ?
- How do we have to manage the discussion with referees ?
- Do we have to discuss with them about the opinions we got from team officials ?
- Shall we give them some hints for future matches in order to improve their next performances?



After the match – in case of a protest

- PROCEDURE:

- ✓ Protests shall be announced to the EHF delegate orally after the end of the match
- ✓ The reason of the protest shall be handed over in writing within 30 min after the end of the match. At the same time a protest fee of 400€ has to be paid. If the protest is accepted the deposit will be refunded.
- ✓ The EHF Disciplinary Commission takes its decision by a simple majority 1h before the start of the next match of the team concerned
- ✓ All decisions taken by the Disciplinary Commission (1st and 2nd instance) are final decisions
