### **Overview - summary, discussions & working session**

- general impression it would be useful to adhere to the 'RC'
- o a couple of nations are (almost) fulfilling the 'RC' standard requirements concerning the coaches' education & instruction (ARM, EST, FIN, ITA, LAT, MNE, TUR)

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- different structure and philosophy: ENG, IRL, ITA solutions / alternative options might be founded for a positive / constructive approach
- there is a strong tendency to built up special institutes / institutions for educating the coaches (ARM, FIN, MNE, TUR)
- (almost) general conviction: by being part of the 'RC', the possibility to reach the 'normal stage / standard' will be enlarged & speed – up
- still persisting the main concern (wearing specific aspects nations): how to harmonise the existing differences (i.e. high qualified foreigner coaches (licensed in a special 'restrictive qualified' institute/institution) asked to teach and educate pupils / normal schools in the field of handball)
- a short but complete overview (with concrete examples) about 'S.M.A.R.T.
  Programme' & 'FOSTER Project' has been offered, as a realistic option and solution in reaching the standard and fulfilling the 'RC' standard requirements

#### Conclusion, follow – up

- The participants will provide the achieved information internally consultation and discussions within each National Federation.
- By comparing the (different) way & methods of achieving the respective education, it seems that in fact it is more a question of bureaucracy than a real structural problem.
- Three nations showed strong interest in becoming as soon as possible a 'RC' signatory: ENG, MNE, and TUR.
- After working at all necessary levels intensively and pro-active, end of May 2009, should be (unanimously accepted) the deadline for providing the EHF with the respective statements / documents.
