EHF Technical Bodies and Educational Services

The scope of tasks of the Technical Commissions - Competition Commission (CC), Methods Commission (MC) and Beach Handball Commission (BC) — is laid down in the EHF Statutes. Several non-statutory advisory bodies support the work of the Technical Commissions. The chairmen of the Technical Commissions are represented in the EHF Technical Delegation as well as in the EHF Competence Academy & Network (CAN) Advisory Board in order to coordinate commission activities and educational services in cooperation with the EHF Executive Committee and the EHF Office Business Group "Education and Development".

EHF Lecturer System


Education, Further Education and Training are part of the core activities of the EHF Technical Bodies. The EHF Lecturer system aims at the cooperation with European handball specialists who help the EHF to produce various publications, to discuss and clarify handball related questions, but most of all to support and carry out national and regional EHF technical courses. In addition to the EHF Lecturers it is possible to nominate external handball experts as well as EHF Commission Members by the respective Technical Commission in case of necessity.

After the 9th Ordinary Congress in Vienna / AUT (September 2008) the 3 EHF Technical Commissions decided upon the EHF Lecturers in the fields of coaching, refereeing and Beach Handball.
