You might be sent and/or invited to various kinds of courses:

- EHF top coaches seminars
- EHF young coaches seminars
- young referee courses with accompanying tournament
- regional and national further education courses for coaches as well as for referees

Basics:

Be aware that in any course you are involved you will be a representative of the EHF. Therefore some general key points have to be respected:

Be careful about all statements – sometimes your personal view or opinion might not be in complete accordance with the official line of the EHF, avoid getting trapped in situations like this.

If, for any kind of reason, you are forced to give a personal statement, make it very clear, that this is the case but refer to the official line (team spirit).

Collect information about the line of refereeing and apply it in your methodical drills.

Always use the official equipment in your personal outfit.

Refer to the available support instruments of the EHF – publications, documentations, etc. and pass on the information how to get in touch with these.

Procedure:

If you are sent in an official mission, refer to the procedure outlined in the manual.

If you are invited on a private basis, give notice to the office about the time period and the place in advance. After the event just send a short report, including the relevant data (in order to keep the data bank of the office on actual status).

In case you have to take tests, include the questionnaire and the points of the practical test in your report.

In any course joint with rule and/or refereeing matters make contact with S. Andorka and/or the office to harmonise the presentations.
