


2008 EHF Wheelchair Handball Event


Numerous courses and seminars were held in the last years under the guidance of the EHF Methods Commission.

Team AUT / Conveen Sitting Bulls

Initially, wheelchair basketball in the RZ Weißer Hof was only for physical training. That was until, in 1989, someone introduced an "official" training session, which has been held once a week ever since. In 1990, the Conveen Sitting Bulls entered the Austrian State Championship (B-league) for the very first time. As a further consequence, the activities were continually expanded; tournaments were constantly organised and the Conveen Sitting Bulls participated in many events, in order to measure and compare their skills in national and international competitions alike.



For the first time with the Austrian State Championship in 1995 they reached the best four of an Austrian final, with which the vice state champions title was fixed.

The year 2002 saw the Conveen Sitting Bulls attain their crowning glory that accentuated their development, with the long desired title of State Champions.

Team SWE / H43

Lunds Handbollsklubb av år was founded 65 years ago. The first team, H43 was established by a number of students interested in playing handball. They asked their teacher, Yngve Wallmer, if he would be kind enough to support this initiative and be their coach. Yngve Wallmer happily supported the students and helped them form the club. which came into being on October 1st 1943.

Today, H43 has approximately 75 trainers/leaders who train the various teams every week, providing the

children and youth with a good physical and social upbringing as well as a meaningful recreational time. Altogether there are about 35 teams, with some 600 players, playing in the regular series in south Sweden. H43 has always been a "family" club. Everyone is welcome and everyone has a place. This attitude can be seen at the elite training where the team is practising in one hall and their small kids enjoy playing with a club trainer and "babysitter".

It is this attitude that everyone is welcome and that there is something for everyone in the club that facilitated for wheelchair handball, which was introduced to the club in 2007. As soon as it was proposed to form a wheelchair team the whole club came together in a joint effort to realise the project.
