## Course Basics

The 2008 EHF "Rinck" Convention Seminar will take place at the European Handball Federation (EHF) Office in Vienna/AUT from May 14 – 15, 2008. The course is part of the 2008 EHF Methods Commission activity plan and will be organized in cooperation with the EHF Competence Academy&Network. The course participants will represent the 15 EHF Rinck Convention signatories AUT, BUL, CRO, CZE, DEN, FRA, GER, HUN, NOR, POL, POR, RUS, SLO, SVK, SWE and the designated 16th member SUI (to sign the convention at the 9th Ordinary EHF Congress in September 2008).

### Who should attend

The EHF seminar is open for attendance of the Rinck Convention signatory nations representatives nominated by their national federations.

A further Rinck Convention information seminar for non-signatory EHF member nations will be held at the EHF Office in Vienna/AUT later this year from 15-16 November 2008.
