 - b) regional training courses for EHF delegates (3 year cycle)

 - a) 3 lecturers from CC, MC, CC Lecturer Staff, or external specialists

- 4) DURATION: 3 days

- 6) ENTRY CRITERIA: delegates nominated by National Federations
- 7) BASIC REQUIREMENTS: proper command of English language, IHF Rules of the Game and EHF Regulations
- 8) TESTING:
 - a) Theoretical: 1 test on event management and regulations (75% = passing criterion), 1 test on refereeing methods and rules (75%= passing criterion), 1 communication skill test in the English language
 - b) Practical: 1 test on officiating and feedback

Curriculum of EHF Referee Candidate Educational Courses

- 1) Organisation: EHF in cooperation with National Federations as local organisers (High level handball tournament obligatory)
- 2) Type: course for EHF referee candidates nominated by National Federations (based on the EHF Structure of Refereeing)

3) COURSE LECTURERS/ADMINISTRATORS:

- a) 3-lecturers from CC (refereeing and coaching) and EHF Lecturer Staff
- b) 1-2 administrators from EHF Office/EHF CAN
- 4) DURATION: 7 days
- 5) LANGUAGE: English

6) ENTRY CRITERIA

- a) A copy of the passport.
- b) A handball CV of the candidate(s).
- c) Medical attest of max. 1 month old.
- d) A summary of the physical tests and the results signed as a true statement by the chief-referee

7) BASIC REQUIREMENTS:

- a) Physical conditions (Cooper test, Shuttle Run test etc.)
- b) Theoretical knowledge (IHF Rules, EHF Regulations etc.)
- c) Language: Ability to communicate in English.
- d) Ability to manage a match on the highest national level in a sufficient way.
- e) Ability to learn "on the job" and to improve.
- Realistic view on his/her actual level of competence and the domains of competency which have to be improved.(realistic objectives).

8) TESTING:

- a) Theoretical: 1rule test
- b) Practical: 2 physical tests (Shuttle run test, Cooper test)

9) TOPICS OF LECTURES:

- a) Expectations (physical conditions, theoretical knowledge, English knowledge)
- b) Procedure before, during and after a match (preparation for the match, responsibility, interrelations, conversations)
- c) Refereeing from the coach point-of-view (entering the goal area, passive play, foul in attack play, dramatic behaviour, advantage)
- d) What do the coaches desire from referees (formal factors, decision-making, communication)
- e) Fair-play-acting (fake actions, injury or not, provocative behaviour)
- f) Common line for our success (goalkeeper, back court player, centre back/playmaker, pivot, winger, defence specialist, counter-attack, the order of the substitution area)





- g) Moving path on the court (correct moving, moving mistakes)
- h) Defensive actions in the goal area, 7 m or not? (intentional and unintentional entry, infringement of goal area, blocking dash using goal area and above goal area)
- Refereeing is about communication (facial expressions, personality, progressive behaviour

Curriculum of Beach Handball Educational Courses

- 1) Organisation: EHF in cooperation with National Federations as local organisers (High level Beach Handball tournament obligatory)
- 2) Type: combined course for referees, delegates and coaches
- 3) Course Lecturers/Administrators:
 - a) 3-4 lecturers from Beach Handball Commission, Beach Handball Lecturer Staff
 - b) 1-2 administrators from EHF Office/EHF CAN
- 4) DURATION: 4 days
- 5) LANGUAGE: English
- 6) ENTRY CRITERIA:
 - a) Beach Handball experience / involvement in the national Beach Handball activities.
 - b) Under 30 years of age.
 - c) English as a foreign language is obligatory.
 - d) Female referees, delegates and coaches are very welcome.
 - e) Nominations of federations which have no Beach Handball referees and/or delegates are preferred.

7) BASIC REQUIREMENTS:

- a) Referees: Health confirmation obligatory (not older than 2 months) physical test at the course.
- b) Referees and Delegates: Beach Handball Rules of the Game 2nd Edition rule tests at the course.
- c) Delegates: European Championship Regulations for Beach Handball and the official EHF Beach Handball Match Report test on regulations at the course.
- d) Coaches: Basic and advanced knowledge on Beach Handball techniques, playing and substitution strategies.
- 8) TESTING:
 - a) Theoretical: 2 rule tests, 1 delegate test
 - b) Practical: 1 physical test (for referees)
- 9) TOPICS OF LECTURES:
 - a) For all:
 - History of Beach Handball
 - Marketing (marketing mix, responsibilities and expenses, important people, common objectives, branding, event production, competition guidelines, tips for effective events)
 - b) For referee candidates:
 - Rules (differences between indoor and Beach Handball).
 - Red cards.
 - Progressive behaviour.
 - Progressive punishments.
 - Spectacular goals.
 - Other referee tasks.





- c) For delegates:
 - Tips for new delegates.
 - Delegate's tasks (before, during and after the match; how to manage a protest).
- d) For coaches:
 - Philosophy of Beach Handball.
 - Special players (scorer, assistant, "Troyan Horse").

- 2) TYPES:
 - a) Coaching courses for youth handball coaches.
 - b) Top Coaches Seminar for top level handball coaches.
- 3) Course Lecturers/Administrators:
 - a) 3 lecturers from MC, MC/CC (refereeing) Lecturer Staff, or external specialists
 - b) 1-2 administrators from EHF Office/EHF CAN
- 4) DURATION: 4 days
- 5) LANGUAGE: English
- 6) ENTRY CRITERIA: open course, valid registration following financial conditions
- 7) Basic requirements: proper command of English language
- 8) TESTING / ADDITIONAL OFFER: no testing, but EHF offer to visit Euro Event matches
- 9) TOPICS OF LECTURES / PROGRAMME (COMPARE EXAMPLE ATTACHED !!!):
 - a) Course programme to be worked out and finalized in the EHF MC
